

## MAILBOX REMINDER

Check your mailbox. Make sure it is not hanging over into the street and check the base to make sure it is structurally sound. **ONLY** mailboxes damaged by a Borough plow or vehicle will be replaced. Mailboxes that collapse or break due to rotten or defective bases will not be replaced. **Mailboxes replaced by the Borough will ONLY be replaced with a standard type mailbox.**



## CANCELLATIONS DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER

## SNOW EVENT PARKING BAN Borough Ordinance 7-3.3

Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the streets or highways within the Borough, an emergency shall exist, and no vehicle shall be parked on any street or portion thereof.

The parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.



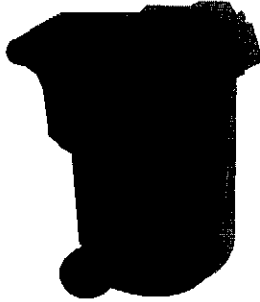
## HOLIDAY TREES

Holiday trees may be placed at the curb for collection from January 2, 2013 through January 11, 2013. If you miss the tree collection, you may bring your tree to the recycling drop off located behind Borough Hall or wait for your scheduled zone pick up for brush and branch. Place your tree at the curb free of ornaments and bags as the ornaments and bags cannot be recycled. Wreaths and garland made from trees may be placed in your refuse container.

## BOROUGH RECYCLING DROP OFF HOLIDAY HOURS

The Borough Drop-Off center located behind Borough Hall will be open Monday – Friday 7:00 am – 3:30 pm, Saturday 7:00 am – 12:00 pm & 12:30 – 3:30 pm.

From December 28<sup>th</sup> until January 31<sup>st</sup> Public Works will be providing **seven days per week** access to its facility to drop off extra recyclables “single stream style”, extra household refuse, cardboard, Holiday trees, and household electronics. Please use the bins marked for your items and come whenever you want!



## AUTOMATED CAN REPAIR

In the event your garbage or recycling can is damaged, the Borough will replace or repair your can as deemed necessary at no cost.

Call the Department of Public Works if you have a problem with your can and we will schedule an appointment for repair or replacement.

Additional green automated cans and blue automated cans are available for lease @ \$55.00 per can. When the leased container(s) is returned to the Borough, a refund will be issued. When the container is returned, the refund will be depreciated over a ten year period on an annual basis of Five (\$5.00) per year.

# Pet Waste Pollutes Our Waters

Animal waste contains a high concentration of nutrients as well as bacteria and disease-causing microorganisms that can cause problems.

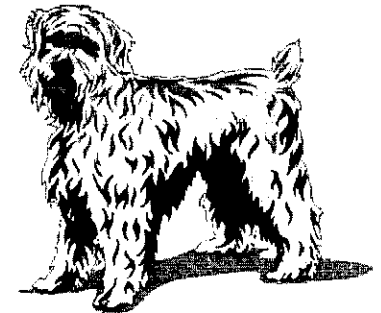
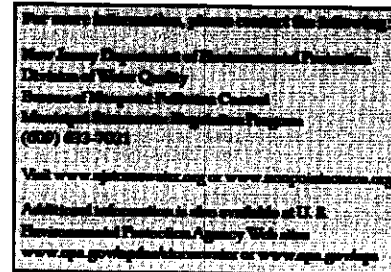
### **What you can do**

Pet owners or anyone who takes your pet for walks must properly dispose of the waste by picking it up, wrapping it and either placing it in the trash or flushing it unwrapped down the toilet.

Your municipality is required to adopt and enforce local pet-waste laws. At a minimum, your community must require that pet owners or their keepers immediately and properly dispose of their pet's solid waste deposited on any public or private property not owned or possessed by that person. People with assistance animals such as Seeing Eye dogs are exempt.

Make sure you know what your municipality requires – and follow it.

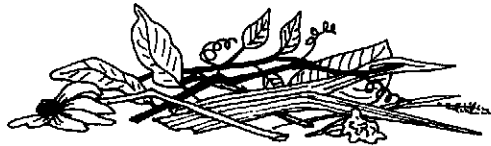




## LEAVES & PINE NEEDLES

Place in long low piles above the curb at the edge of the road. Do not mix leaves and pine needles with branches and brush. Leaves and pine needles are collected **only** during the months of **May, November and December**. Leaves and pine needles **should not** be put out any other time.

Material must be placed above the curb at the edge of the road no earlier than the Saturday prior to your zone pick-up, and no later than 7:00 AM Monday on the week of your scheduled zone pick-up. Violators may receive a summons for non-compliance.



## BRUSH & BRANCH

Place in long low piles above the curb at the edge of the road. **Branches can be no longer than five feet in length. Tree stumps or large tree trunks in excess of six inches in diameter will not be collected nor accepted at the Tinton Falls Recycling Drop-off.** Pine needles should be placed out with leaves. Do not mix leaves or pine needles with brush and branch.

Do not place brush and branch out for collection after your street has been picked up. If you miss your scheduled pick-up, you may bring your branches and brush to the Tinton Falls Recycling Drop-off Center located behind Borough Hall.

## GRASS

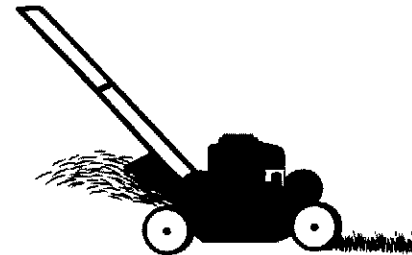
It is suggested that you cut it and leave it on the lawn. Grass clippings will not be picked up. Do not leave grass clippings at the curb. **Do not** mix grass clippings with leaves, branches and brush or with household garbage. Grass **will not** be accepted at the Borough recycling center behind Borough Hall. You may take your grass to the Monmouth County Reclamation Center grass drop-off site which is located on Asbury Avenue, West of Shafto Road in Tinton Falls.

Their hours of operation are: Monday thru Friday:  
7:00 AM to 3:30 PM,  
and Saturday: 7:00 AM to 2.00 PM.

Drop-off fees are \$3.00 per passenger car load or \$35.00 per ton for trucks (\$0.35 per 20 lbs.). Station Wagons, Minivans and SUV-type vehicles qualify for the passenger car rate only when all grass is behind the rear-most seat.

Enter through the main landfill entrance and proceed to the scale house.

**Do not place brush/branch or leaves or any other yard material within 10 feet of a storm drain.**



**CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS.** Construction debris is the responsibility of the contractor and/or resident to remove. This includes lumber, paneling, plasterboard, roofing material, wood fence, concrete, asphalt or brick and similar items. Most of the above items may be brought to the Monmouth County Reclamation Center located on Shafto Road in Tinton Falls. For more information on disposal hours and cost you may call the Monmouth County Reclamation Center at 732-683-8686.

Construction debris will not be accepted at the Tinton Falls Recycling drop-off located behind Borough Hall. Anyone who dumps/places construction debris at their curb or at the Tinton Falls Recycling Drop Off may be issued a summons for illegal dumping.

**COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS** You may bring your compact fluorescent bulbs to any Home Depot to be recycled. Take the bulbs to the return counter.

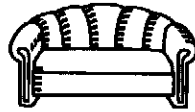

**PAINT/PAINT CANS. OIL BASED PAINT** must be brought the Hazardous Waste Facility. **LATEX BASED PAINT** may be brought to the Hazardous Waste Facility or if the can is only partially full, the paint can be easily dried and the can recycled.



If the can is completely empty and cleaned, lids must be removed and the can should be put your recycling bin.



**BULK ITEMS. To schedule a bulk item or metal pick-up, call 542-3400 Ext. 4.**

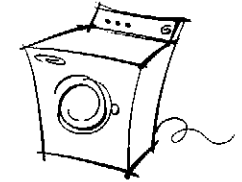
Large items which will not fit into your automated container must be scheduled for collection. Bulk collection is twice a month. Televisions and electronics will not be collected at the curb. The north end of town (from Newman Springs Road/Shrewsbury Avenue to Tinton Avenue) is collected on the first and third Wednesday of the month. The south end of town (from Tinton Avenue to Rt. 33 Neptune) is collected on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month.

Bulk items will not be collected unless an appointment for pick up has been made in advance. Only bulk items are collected. Bagged or boxed items will not be collected on bulk day and must be placed with your household refuse. Items cannot be placed at the curb until dusk the night preceding your scheduled collection date, but **MUST** be at the curb by 7:00 AM on the day of the scheduled pick-up.

Construction debris, wood, windows or doors will **NOT** be collected and cannot be placed at the curb with your bulk or in your automated refuse container. Contractors are responsible for removal and disposal of their debris.

**LARGE METAL ITEMS AND TIRES.**

Item pick-up is scheduled in advance by calling Public Works, 732-542-3400, Ext. 4. The north end of town (from Newman Springs Road/Shrewsbury Avenue to Tinton Avenue) is collected on the first and third Wednesday of the month. The south end of town (from Tinton Avenue to Rt. 33 Neptune) is collected on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month. Items cannot be placed at the curb until the night preceding the scheduled collection date, but **MUST** be at the curb by 7:00 AM on the day of the scheduled pick-up. Doors must be removed from appliances and tires must be separated from the rim. Propane tanks, Televisions and Electronics will not be collected at the curb.

To dispose of propane tanks, call the Monmouth County Hazardous Waste facility at 732-922-2234 to make an appointment for disposal.

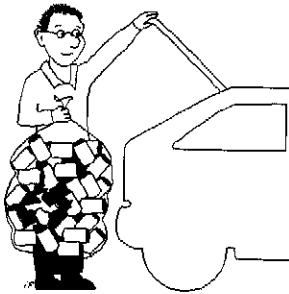

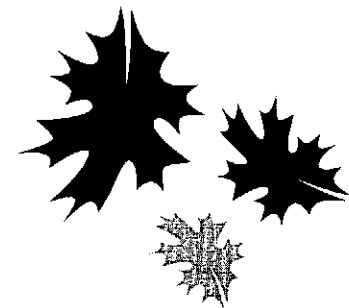

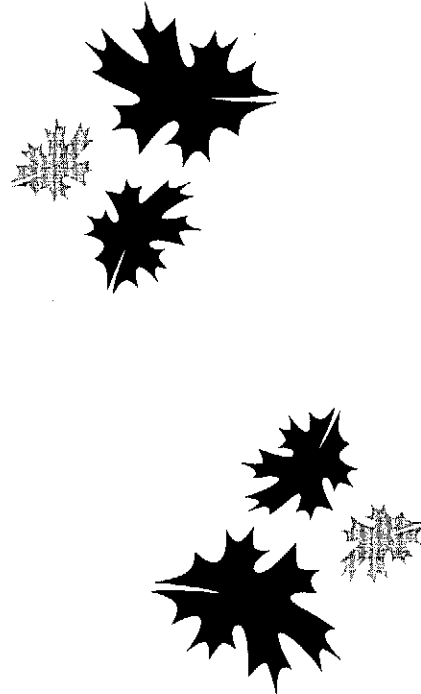

**ALUMINUM CANS.** Place in blue automated recycling container.

**ALUMINUM PANS & BALLED ALUMINUM FOIL.**

Clean pans & foil can be placed in your recycling container.

**TIN & BI-METAL CANS.** Place in blue automated recycling container. Cans must be rinsed of food residue.

**PLASTIC BOTTLES.** Plastic bottles pourable bottles with caps removed. It does not matter what number is in the triangle. Remove caps. Place caps in refuse container.

**PLASTIC TUBS & LIDS,**

**PLASTIC SCREW TOP JARS.** Plastic tubs and lids like yogurt, butter, cottage cheese, peanut butter jars, baby wipe containers and take out containers. All items must be rinsed of food residue.

**PLASTIC NOT ACCEPTED WITH SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING**

- Plastic Toys
- Laundry Baskets
- **Plastic Bags**
- Flower pots or trays
- Plastic hangers
- Plastic cutlery or dishes
- Plastic 6-pack holders
- Foam containers or peanuts

**GLASS BOTTLES & JARS.** Rinse bottle or jar and place in blue automated recycling container.

**GLASS NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING**

- Mirror and/or window glass
- Ceramic cups and/or plates
- Light bulbs
- Drinking glasses
- Clay flower pots

# NO PLASTIC BAGS

**NEWSPAPERS.** Everything that comes with the newspaper can go into the blue automated container. **DO NOT TIE PAPERS**

**TELEPHONE BOOKS.** Place your whole telephone book in your blue automated container.

**HARDCOVER BOOKS.** Can be put in your automated container.

**CHIPBOARD** Chipboard is similar to a very thin cardboard. It comes in different forms; like cereal boxes, soda and beer sleeves, shoe boxes, gift boxes, macaroni boxes, toilet paper rolls, paper towel rolls and wrapping paper rolls, paper egg cartons. Flatten and place in your blue automated container.

**CORRUGATED CARDBOARD & BROWN PAPER BAGS.**

Flatten and place loosely in your blue automated container. No waxed cardboard like milk cartons, orange juice cartons or drink boxes.

**SHREDDED PAPER.** Place in a brown paper bag and put in your automated container.

# SPRING CLEANUP APRIL 2012

The Department of Public Works will again have Spring Cleanup this year. Unlike the regular twice a month bulk collection, there is no appointment required for Spring Cleanup. The same rules apply, however, regarding when items should be put out to the curb. The twice a month bulk collection, which requires an appointment, will be cancelled during April, 2012.

Cleanup week will give residents the opportunity to put out furniture, fence, wood, etc for collection. Wood must be bundled and tied. Bundles no longer than 5 feet, no heavier than 50 pounds each.

The following items will **not** be collected as part of Cleanup Week. These items should be disposed of in the regular manner:

- \* **Metal items or appliances.** (Call for an appointment)
- \* **Concrete/brick/asphalt.**
- \* **Construction debris** created or left by an outside contractor.
- \* **Creosoted lumber** will not be collected.
- \* **Hazardous waste** - No paint, pesticides, etc.
- \* **Boxed or bagged items.** – Place bagged Garbage in Refuse container. Breakdown your cardboard boxes and place in your blue automated container for collection.
- \* **Brush/branches/leaves** - collected separately, by zone by a separate truck.

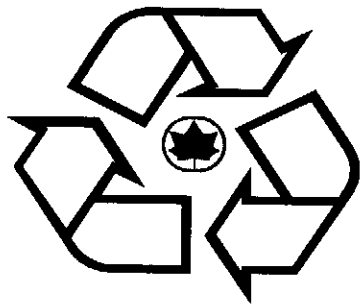

## SHOPPING BAG PROGRAM

### 20 BAGS FOR 1 REUSABLE BAG



In an effort to reduce the ongoing problem of plastic shopping bags littering our landscapes and clogging our waterways, the Borough of Tinton Falls Department of Public Works and Recycling is purchasing reusable shopping bags for Borough residents to use for their shopping needs.

#### *What do you need to do to get one?*

Bring 20 or more plastic shopping bags to the Department of Public Works Recycling Drop Off at 556 Tinton Avenue between the hours of 7:00 am - 3:30 pm Monday through Friday.

Two bags per residential address will be given in exchange for 20 plastic shopping bags for each reusable shopping bag. The bags are the perfect size for a quick trip to the grocery or convenience store and will send the message to fellow shoppers that we care about our environment.

Shrink-wrap and dry cleaning plastic bags may be recycled through this program as well.

The plastic bags will be recycled through Goodwill Industries of Southern New Jersey & Philadelphia. They recycle them through their "BagSmart" program. The plastic bags are sorted and baled by Goodwill employees, then transported to Penn Jersey Paper who facilitates their conversion into the plastic decking materials, such as that produced by "Trex", etc.

The bags are being purchased utilizing grant funds supplied by the Department of Environmental Protection. The grant is issued each year to all municipalities in New Jersey submitting a tonnage grant application. Money issued is based on the amount of recyclables a municipality recycles.

**Keep recycling!**

The more we recycle, the more grant money the Borough is entitled to!

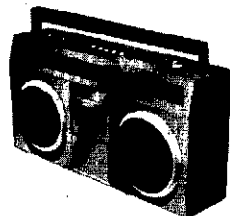

## MONMOUTH COUNTY COMPUTER AND ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DROP OFF
