NJ Historic Trust Grant: March notification anticipated. It is anticipated that the interior and utilities would be completed if the grant is won.

1188 Sycamore roof was closed before the winter storms, and progress continues. Evidence of new windows and siding is visible from the street.

Grist Mill Property Jim Brooks had e-mailed some new drawings that will go to the Planning Board in the near future (when?). Gail Hunton will be happy to provide a knowledgeable review and submitted her resume and professional rates. From whose budget will she be paid (TFHPC or Planning Board)?

New Business:

Oral History: We have a request to interview Evelyn Oryll, 94, who lived on Water Street for 60+ years into the 1980's. She is a current resident of Wanamassa. Kathy brought our oral histories converted to DVD. A proposal for a computer service station to capture oral history was submitted by DVD Creations. DVD Creations would reap 20% of the cost and TFHPC would gain 80% of a fee charged to capture and transfer to CD.
